Hiawatha Residents Can Now Enjoy Rainbow Fiber

Over the past year, Rainbow has diligently worked to bring fiber to Hiawatha, and we're thrilled to announce we're ready to connect residents to our state-of-the-art fiber network. It offers lightning-fast Internet speeds of up to 2 Gigabits per second.

All Hiawatha residential Internet customers should have received an informational packet in early June detailing the conversion process, the benefits of fiber, and their new speed plans. If you only have Rainbow phone service, watch for a separate notification in October.

Connecting every Hiawatha resident to the fiber network will require an in-home installation with new Internet and/or phone service equipment. We

urge all Hiawatha residential customers to schedule their installation appointments as soon as possible, as our goal is to transition over 1,000 homes to the fiber network by Thanksgiving.

Rainbow is upgrading from coaxial cable to fiber to enhance speed, reliability, and security. With the hashtag #FiberDelivers, we emphasize our commitment to providing top-notch Internet in our rural communities that matches or surpasses what's available in urban areas. We're investing \$25-\$30 million in our fiber network to support economic growth and ensure residents will have the bandwidth they need.

Hiawatha is the first of eight Rainbow towns to undergo this upgrade. Next will be Seneca, where our contracted fiber construction crew, North Central Service (NCS) from Bemidji, MN, will begin work in July. They'll be burying fiber mainlines, hanging drops, and attaching enclosure fiber boxes to homes. This construction phase is expected to last three to four months.

Stay tuned for updates on Rainbow's fiber upgrades.

Your home may be beautiful. But is it also smart? Thanks to Home Technology Integration, your home can become a smart home and enable you to remotely manage a variety of systems using an Internet connection. The technology can be divided into two basic functions: systems control and monitoring.

Systems Control

Via a smartphone or tablet, it's now possible to control a long list of things in a smart home without you having to be there. They include:

- · Heating, air conditioning, and ventilation
- · Whole-house music and entertainment
- Appliances

- Blinds
- Lighting
- Locks on doors and gates

This can be done on a case-by-case basis, or you can develop profiles that will automatically manage these systems depending on the time of day, day of the week, or only when motion is detected. Not only is it convenient to have a smart home, it can also save you money through increased energy efficiency.

Monitoring

Do you worry about your home when you're away for long vacations or business trips? With a smart home, you can use your Internet connection to monitor for things like temperature, fire, motion, or flooding. Sensors detecting any of these events can email you an alert.

For example, let's say the sump pump quits working and your basement is filling up with water. You'll receive an email alerting you of the emergency so you can call the plumber immediately. When the plumber arrives at your locked front door, a motion detector will tell you someone is at the door. A snapshot video camera will send you a picture confirming it's the plumber and you can then unlock the door — all without having to be there!

Other smart home possibilities include streaming video surveillance to keep an eye on family members, pets, or a backyard pool. For sick or elderly family members, Personal Alert Systems are also available to quickly contact emergency personnel.

"How much Internet speed do I need?" Rainbow hears this question a lot from customers, and there's no single right answer. For some customers, a download speed of up to 50 Mbps may work fine. Other households may need a download speed of up to 400 Mbps or more to keep everybody in the family happy.

To select the best Internet speed for your household, it's important to consider these factors:

- · How many devices do you have in your home? Take a look around and add up all the Internet-connected devices you own including computers, tablets, smartphones, smart TVs, video game consoles, and streaming media set-top boxes. Deloitte, the multinational professional services company, released a 2023 Connected Consumer survey that indicates the average U.S. household has 21 connected devices. The more devices you have, the more speed you need.
- · How do you use the Internet? If you only have a desktop computer that's used to check email and surf the net, then a relatively slow Internet connection may suffice. However, if you have a family of people simultaneously using your Internet

- connection for data-intensive activities such as streaming HD movies and shows, online gaming, video conferences, and cloud storage — then you're only going to be happy with an upper-level speed.
- · What are your performance expectations? If you only occasionally watch videos online, you may be willing to tolerate slow load times and buffering. But if streaming HD movies is a cherished part of your routine, you'll be frustrated by slow speeds and the annoying lag that comes with them. Make sure the Internet speed you choose is in line with the value you place on Internet performance quality.

Fiber-Optic Network Build Nears Completion in Doniphan County

We've made significant progress in our fiber expansion project thanks to help from Doniphan County and its ARPA funding. ARPA is the American Rescue Plan Act, which provides significant funding to support recovery and infrastructure improvements, including rural broadband expansion. Rainbow's fiber network will soon pass 120 homes in Doniphan County along Highway 36 between Troy and Wathena, bringing Internet speeds up to 2 Gigabits per second.



Installing fiber typically costs around \$9,000 per location, but residents in this area can get connected at no construction cost due to the ARPA funding. Residents within the build area received informational packets in April announcing the next steps, which include submitting their addresses so they can be placed on Rainbow's fiber drop list. In-home installation is expected to begin in July.
